

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The 2007 CMS South Central Conference Keynote Speaker: Randall Pembrook

Randall Pembrook, Dean of the Conservatory of Music and Dance at the University of Missouri-Kansas City, received his Bachelors and Masters Degrees in Music Education as well as Piano Performance at Southern Illinois University-Edwardsville. His doctoral work was completed at Florida State University. Dr. Pembrook has served on the editorial boards of *The Journal of Research in Music Education, The Quarterly*, and *Symposium*, and is currently a board member for *Psychomusicology* and *The Missouri Journal of Research in Music Education* for which he served as editor from 1992 to 1994. His research interests include music perception, aural skills, teacher training, and theory pedagogy. Dr. Pembrook has published numerous articles in state, regional, and national journals. In 1996, he was recognized as the Outstanding Interdisciplinary Faculty Award winner at the University of Missouri-Kansas City and has received the Conservatory Excellence in Teaching Award.

Young Members Introduced ...

Heidi Cohenour Gordon (BM University of Texas at Austin 1993, MM Southeastern Louisiana University 2000, DMA University of Oklahoma 2007) is in her third year on the faculty at the University of Arkansas at Pine Bluff, where she teaches studio voice, diction, vocal literature, music theory, piano, and music appreciation. Ms. Gordon directs the opera workshop and serves as assistant director of the Vesper Choir, which toured last March in Italy. A NATS (National Association of Teachers of Singing) winner herself, she took six of her students to their first regional NATS competition in



November, where one of them took first place in his category. Last May, she performed a recital featuring

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works of Liszt, Mozart, and Walton for the National Federation of Music Clubs. Later in the year, she gave a lecture recital on the songs of American composer David Guion.

Ms. Gordon has been soprano soloist with orchestras, in such works as Händel's *Messiah*, Mozart's *Missa in C*, Vivaldi's *Gloria*, and Victoria's *Missa O magnum mysterium*. Ms. Gordon has performed throughout Texas, Louisiana, Oklahoma, and New Mexico as Fiordiligi in *Così fan tutte* and Gianetta in *Gondoliers*, in comprimario roles in *The Ballad of Baby Doe*, *Louise*, *Les malheurs d'Orphée*, *Gianni Schicchi*, and in various musical theater and zarzuela productions. Besides teaching and performing, she chairs the departmental curriculum committee and elections sub-committee of the Faculty Staff Senate and serves on the Teacher Education and Founder's Day committees. Her teachers and coaches have included Scharmal Schrock, Clara O'Brien, Dolores Leffingwell, Howard Lubin, Salvatore Champagne, and Meryl Mantione. In February, her students will again perform several opera scenes under her direction at the annual Wildwood College Opera Festival in Little Rock. Ms. Gordon will perform Strauss' *Brentano Lieder* this April at UABP and will complete the DMA from the University of Oklahoma later this year.



New Chapter Member

Washington García began his musical studies in Quito, Ecuador. He holds a Bachelor of Music from the National Conservatory of Music in Ecuador, and Master and Doctoral degrees from the Peabody Institute of the Johns Hopkins University. He has performed as soloist and recitalist in Chile, Spain, Austria, Switzerland, France, Italy, Hungary, Israel, Canada, Ecuador, and the United

States. He has also been featured in broadcasts by national and international radio and TV stations. In addition to winning numerous prizes in national and international competitions, Dr. Garcia has been recipient of awards granted by the Peabody Institute of the Johns Hopkins University, the Ecuadorian Government, and a \$25,000 career development grant given by the Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts in Washington DC to two pianists representing thirty three countries. Dr. García was also named a Presser scholar, which included a grant by the Presser Music Foundation.

Dr. García served as a faculty member at the Peabody Preparatory of the Johns Hopkins University and was recently appointed Assistant Professor of Piano at Texas State University-San Marcos. Upcoming engagements include performances, master classes, and lectures in Texas, Washington DC, California, New Jersey, Hong Kong, and Canada. In addition to adjudicating competitions in the Dallas and San Antonio areas, Dr. García will also serve on the faculty of the Heart of Texas Suzuki Workshop and the Austin Chamber Music Summer Festival.

He aims to make Texas State University a destination school for piano students from all over the world, but do so in a way that remains financially accessible to them. His vision also focuses on recruiting and maintaining quality students who would represent the University on the concert platform at the highest level. He takes Texas State's "Rising Star" mantra to heart and eagerly looks forward to collaborating with other colleagues in the region and the country to share his passion for music with the younger generation of musicians.
