As a professional chamber musician, I have performed with Panorámicos, Music from Angel Fire, ChamberFest Cleveland, New Hampshire Music Festival, as well as musicians from Lincoln Center and Carnegie Hall.

Teaching Chamber Music is my passion! I have organized Adult Amateur Symposiums in conjunction with ACMP, have coached chamber music extensively, and consult with program directors (at a very reasonable rate).

Embracing our differences and celebrating diversity through collaboration is at the core of making chamber music, recognizing each voice as unique and how they enrich the fabric of the music, which is a perfect model for the greater purpose of making a positive change in the world. Fostering a culture that celebrates and engages differences broadens our understanding and acceptance of one another. Having knowledge of the score and chamber music skills makes a more complete musician, which will only support and inform large ensemble playing.
